

# Highlighting City's Services cont.

- **Household Hazardous Waste and Electronics Program:** In accordance with the City agreement with Broward County, residents can drop-off household hazardous waste and electronic waste at the transfer station located at 5601 W. Hallandale Beach Boulevard. This free drop-off service is allowed on Saturdays from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. As reference, attached is the program's flyer as Exhibit "H". ([Click here](#))
- **Bulk Trash & Yard Waste Drop-off Program:** In addition to the City's monthly curbside bulk trash and yard waste pickup services, residents can drop-off bulk trash and yard waste at the Broward County Trash Transfer station located at 5601 W. Hallandale Beach Boulevard, at no cost to the resident. The resident's free drop-off is allowed on Saturdays from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm.
- **Vacation Home Watch Program:** Traveling on vacation? The City's Broward Sheriff's Office offer a free Home Watch Program, as part of the City's service agreement. As part of the service, a deputy or Community Service Aid (CSA) or Citizens on Patrol (COP) volunteer will check your home daily for signs of break-in or suspicious activity while you are out of town. To sign up for the free service, please contact the district office at 954.985.1953.
- **Sign-up for Text Blasts & Email Blasts:** Residents can sign-up to receive text and email blast from the City by visiting the City's website. On the website, use the drop-down icon that states "RESIDENTS", then click "Subscribe/Email/Notify Me". From the list of options, please click applicable option and sign-up. Alternatively, resident may use the fillable form that is scrolling on the home page of the City's website. Attached is a copy of the form as Exhibit "I" ([Click here](#)).
- **Security Alarm System Registration:** In accordance with the City's adopted Ordinance 2014-04, residents and businesses are required to maintain registration on their security alarm system. The goals of the security alarm registration program are to reduce false alarms, reduce response time, maximize police resources by educating the community on ways to prevent false alarms, and encourage alarm users to maintain the operational reliability and proper use of their alarm systems, thereby allowing police officers to be available to respond to legitimate emergency calls for service.
